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PHARMACY CONTROL (FEES) REGULATIONS 2010

I, the Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, make the following regulations under the *Pharmacy Control Act 2001*.

1. Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Pharmacy Control (Fees) Regulations 2010*.

2. Commencement

These regulations take effect on the seventh day after the day on which their making is notified in the *Gazette*.

3. Interpretation

In these regulations –

“**Act**” means the *Pharmacy Control Act 2001*.

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4. Fees

The fees set out in Schedule 1 are prescribed for the purposes of this Act.

5. Legislation rescinded

The legislation specified in Schedule 2 is rescinded.
